



- Countries called in alphabetical order
- 60 second speaking time, No yielding
- Clearly state country stance on agenda (현황, 문제점, 핵심 쟁점)



4. FORMAL DEBATE

A. SPEAKER'S LIST

SPEAKER'S LIST

- GSL/LSL
- Default way of debate
- Speak for 90 seconds

- General Speaker's List: Speech about the general Agenda
- Limited Speaker's List: Speech about a limited (specific) topic, namely an introduced Draft Resolution or Amendment
- When more than 30 seconds remaining: <Yielding>
 - Yield to the chair finish the speech and return to the chair
 - Yield to Another Delegate call another delegate to speak for the time left
 - Yield to Point of Informations (POIs) Q&A about the speech

types of motions (12)

- motion to set the agenda
- motion to set the speaking time
- motion to move into a moderated/unmoderated caucus

- motion to close debate on the resolution/amendment/agenda
- motion to adjourn the meeting/session
- motion to introduce a draft resolution/an amendment
- motion for a roll call vote

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moderated caucus (max. 20 min)

- state purpose, individual speaking time, total duration limit
- delegate must address the committee standing behind his/her seat



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unmoderated caucus (max. 30 min)

- state purpose, total duration limit
- delegates may freely speak and discuss in groups



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unmoderated caucus (max. 30 min)

- state purpose, total duration limit
- delegates may freely speak and discuss in groups

precedence

- moderated > unmoderated caucus
- longer duration time → shorter individual time

Substantive Voting

- Voting on draft resolutions and amendments, abstentions allowed

Procedural Voting

- Voting related to proceedings of the committee, no abstentions allowed

*Abstentions: voting neither for nor against

VOTING PROCEDURE

Substantive Voting

- Voting on draft resolutions and amendments, abstentions allowed

Procedural Voting

Voting related to proceedings of the committee, no abstentions allowed

Super Majority (Two-thirds majority)

- two-thirds or more than two-thirds of the delegates must vote for resolution/amendment

Simple Majority

- more than half of the present delegates must vote for resolution/amendment

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Revote

- when the quorum is not met, a revote must be conducted
- Quorum: minimum number of delegates that must be present to begin the session, set by the simple majority

HEADING

- **Sponsor**: Participated in the drafting of the resolution, and agrees to it. Cannot sponsor multiple resolutions. Must need either 5 or more delegates, or 20% of the committee (whichever is bigger) to get pre-approved.
- Signatory: Irregardless of whether they agree or not, a delegate who wants this resolution to be debated upon. X have to directly draft resolution. Can be signatories of multiple resolutions.
- Main Submitter: The delegate that will formally introduce the draft resolution.

 Must be among the sponsors.

OPERATIVE CLAUSE

- 5. Nequests he cooperation of governments of conflict zones to create educational standards for the nation to comply to, and provide frequent reporting on the status quo to provide transparency of the aided nations through methods such as but not limited (o:
 - evaluating pre-existing fair standards by hosting international conferences, concentrating towards the government to fall suit of such standards, as a requirement for nations of conflict zones to part-take and receive assistance,
 - encouraging nations of conflict zones to follow standards specified in operative clause 3 to receive incentives through ways such as but not limited to:
 - requesting the aided nation to provide data on allocation of funds for education to check its compliance with standards, to encourage transparency and trust,
 - requesting the overview of the curriculum to be implemented in the nation and checking its compliance with standards provided by the UN to respect the cultural and social norms respected in the region while preventing a consequence of gender inequality, deprivation of rights, or the harm of third party groups/individuals,
 - providing periodic updates on the education quality and accessibility of the
 assistance-receiving nation to ensure the implementation of policies in compliance of
 aforementioned outlines through ways such as but not limited to:
 - i. collecting statistics on the effectiveness of standards through monitoring systems,
 - sharing data collected towards additional UN sectors further to be processed within UNDP.
 - offering monetary compensation to organisations for collecting and providing data due to the degree of risk involved,
 - iv. further activating the discontinuation of the monetary funding for the program if the nation does not abile.




